Goat breeds in the United States



Cashgora

The Cashgora is a descendent of a cross between a male Angora goat and a female Cashmere goat. Compared to Cashmere goats, they produce a slightly coarser and longer fiber.



▲ Golden Guernsey

The Golden Guernsey is the smallest of the standard sized dairy goat breeds. The Guernsey in the US was developed using genetics from the rare Golden Guernsey breed from the island of Guernsey in the English channel.

Arapawa ▲

The Arapawa is one of the rarest goat breeds in the world. They originate from Arapawa Island in New Zealand, where they were feral for many years. The breed is being actively conserved. They are a unique genetic resource due to their hardiness.

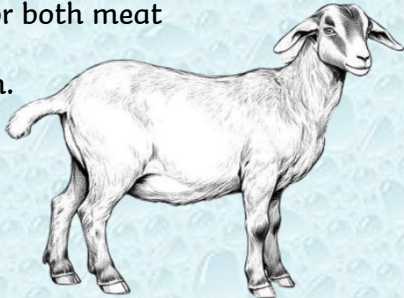


Pygora and Nigora

The Pygora and Nigora are Pygma x Angora and Nigerian Dwarf x Angora crosses, respectively. They produce three different fleece types: Type A (Angora type), Type B (Blend type) and Type C (Cashmere type).

Kinderv ▼

The Kinder is a composite breed of Nubian and Pygmy. It is a compact, well-muscled goat, suitable for both meat and milk production.



Miniature dairy goats ►

Miniature dairy goats are new breeds created by breeding a full-size dairy doe to a Nigerian Dwarf buck. The goal is to produce a mid-size dairy goat that, other than the smaller size, looks like the standard-sized breed.



Sable ▼

A Sable goat is the colored offspring of purebred Saanen goats or Sable x Saanen parents. Apart from coat color, a Sable goat has the same characteristics and qualities as a Saanen.



Texmaster® ▼

The Texmaster® is a composite breed of Myotonic and Boer. The breed was developed by Onion Creek Ranch. They are a large heavy muscled breed.

St. Clemente ▲

The San Clemente Island goat derives from feral goats isolated on San Clemente Island, one of the Channel Islands of California. They are a meat breed, though uncommonly fine-boned and deer-like.
